What is the Jennie Award?

The Jennie award is named in honor of GFWC's founder, Jane Cunningham Croly who wrote for national newspapers under the pseudonym, "Jenny June." The award highlights extraordinary clubwomen who epitomize the spirit of independence, courage and persistence through their roles as volunteers within their clubs, elsewhere in the community and as members of a family or extended family. The GFWC Jennie Award is the only national honor that recognizes individual members for personal excellence. Nominations will be evaluated in three areas: Commitment to Club, Commitment to Community and Commitment to Family.

More Information

Please refer to the Jennie Award information in 2018-2020 GFWC Club Manual (page 232) for all of the details to include: one nominee may be nominated from each club, nominee must be a member in good standing of GFWC clubs for a minimum of 5 years, nominations should emphasize a member's entire lifetime of service, current and past members of the GFWC Executive Committee are ineligible, clubs must complete and submit the official GFWC Jennie Award Nomination Form, (which is fillable on line) along with a maximum 500 word written narrative. (Include club activities, community groups and commitment to family). No more than 25 pages of supportive materials which includes the title-page nomination form and narrative.

Questions

Can a member of the Junior Membership be nominated for the Jennie Award? YES
Can a deceased member be nominated for the Jennie Award? No, nominees for the Jennie
Award must be living when nominated.

The complete list of Award Rules can be found on 233-34 of the GFWC GA manual.

Procedure

The Jennie Award Nomination Form (attached) must be completed and sent by June 1, 2019 to Pat Swan. Pat's email is sbp6388@aol.com. Once the club nominees have been submitted to the State President/State Jennie Award Chairman, the next step is to form an outside panel of judges to assist in selecting the single state nominee. All nominees will be recognized at Institute. Once the State Winner has been selected, the nomination materials (one per state) will be sent to our GFWC Region President postmarked by August 1st for region level judging and the name of our State Finalist will be sent to the GFWC Jennie Award Chairman. One clubwoman from each of the eight GFWC Regions will be selected for national recognition.
